Cybercrime is becoming more sophisticated and cyber criminals target individuals, businesses and government.
If there is any risk of immediate harm or loss of life, call 000 IMMEDIATELY.

What can I report at ReportCyber?



Cyber abuse
Someone is bullying, harassing or stalking you online.



Online image abuse
Someone has shared, or is threatening to share, intimate images or videos of you online.



Cyber Security Incidents
Including denial of service, data exposure theft or loss and unauthorised access to a network or device.



Online fraud
You have been deceived into sending money or goods to someone online, also known as shopping fraud, romance fraud or investment fraud.



Identity theft
Someone has used your personal or business identity information and accessed your online accounts.



Ransomware or malware
Access to your computer system (or files) or mobile device has been locked and someone is demanding that you pay them money to have them unlocked. been taken from your accounts.

Some of these cybercrimes may constitute an offence under Commonwealth and/or state and territory legislation.

When you report:

- ▶ Your report will be referred to the appropriate Police jurisdiction for assessment.
- ▶ The Australian Cyber Security Centre (ACSC) will be unable to advise on the progress of a report.
- ▶ By reporting you are not making a formal police statement.
- ▶ Not all reports are investigated by law enforcement agencies.
- ▶ All reports assists in disrupting operations and helps to make Australia the most secure place to connect online.
- ▶ If you have lost money, contact your financial institution immediately.

You should NOT use ReportCyber when:

- ▶ There is already a court order against the suspect.
- ▶ A physical crime has been committed, such as your debtor credit card or computer has been stolen... instead report to a Police Station or call **131 444**.
- ▶ You have received a scam call and no loss of personal information or money has occurred. Report to the ACCC at **SCAMWATCH.gov.au**
